The U.S. section covers, among other things, the continued scrutiny of shareholder activists, recent proxy access developments and the growing focus on virtual-only annual meetings and dual-class share structures. The Europe portion includes a discussion of recent proposals to regulate executive compensation, new non-financial disclosure requirements and government-sponsored studies on gender and ethnic board diversity. The Asia portion analyzes the possible reconsideration of dual-class shareholder structures in Hong Kong and the implementation and refinement of corporate reform in Japan. The South America section discusses new and proposed corporate governance reforms in Brazil.
