

Considerations for Drafting the 2009 Proxy Statement

While most U.S. companies are now in their third year of implementing the SEC's revised executive compensation disclosure requirements, companies still grapple with new developments and evolving situations related to directors and officers. Although the complexity of the disclosure rules often requires a detailed fact-based analysis in many cases, we provide below a brief summary of some practical considerations on several disclosure points. The SEC has not announced any current plans for widespread review and guidance of 2009 proxy statements.
